IMPORTANT – READ CAREFULLY

THIS BUILDING WILL BE FUMIGATED WITH LETHAL GASES ON THE DATE(S) INDICATED ABOVE. ALL PERSONS AND ANIMALS MUST VACATE THE PREMISES ON OR BEFORE ARRIVAL OF THE FUMIGATION CREW.

UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES CAN ANYONE ENTER THE BUILDING UNTIL THE FUMIGATION COMPANY'S NOTICE IS POSTED GIVING THE TIME AND DATE FOR SAFE RE-ENTRY.

“State law requires that you be given the following information: CAUTION-PESTICIDES ARE TOXIC CHEMICALS. Structural pest control companies are registered and regulated by the Structural Pest Control Board, and apply pesticides which are registered and approved for use by the California Department of Pesticide Regulation and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. Registration is granted when the State finds that based on existing scientific evidence there are no appreciable risks if proper use conditions are followed or that the risks are outweighed by the benefits. The degree of risk depends upon the degree of exposure, so exposure should be minimized.”

If within 24 hours you experience symptoms of dizziness, headache, nausea, reduced awareness, slowed movement, garbled speech or difficulty in breathing, leave the structure immediately and seek medical attention by contacting your physician or Poison Control Center (telephone number) and notify your pest control company. The warning agent, chloropicrin, can cause symptoms of tearing, respiratory distress and vomiting. Entry into the space during fumigation can be fatal.

We suggest that you notify neighbors of the date of fumigation and to keep pets away during the fumigation. Close off any open access to the subarea to prevent pets from entering.

1. A copy of this notice must be signed and on the property when the crew arrives. In the event that a notice is not available on the property the fumigation will be rescheduled. A rescheduling fee may be charged.
2. **IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE PROPERTY OWNER, OWNER'S AGENT, OR OCCUPANT TO HAVE ALL ITEMS ON THIS CHECKLIST DONE BEFORE THE CREW ARRIVES OR THE FUMIGATION MAY BE POSTPONED.**
3. All people must vacate the building(s) being fumigated; remove vehicles from garage/carport if included. Fumigation crew must have key access to vehicles left in structure(s).
4. Remove all plants, interior and potted or hanging from the exterior building area.
5. Remove all animals (including dogs, cats, birds, fish, & turtles) from the house and yard. Disconnect air pump from fish tank. Allow 48 hours before returning birds to building.
6. Remove plastic covers from pillows and mattresses; remove article if cover cannot be removed. Open any zippered garment bags.
7. Any food or medicinal item not in a seal glass or metal container must be removed from the building or sealed as required by the fumigant label. This includes any item that may be eaten such as candy, gum, pet food, and also includes any refrigerated or frozen foods. **FOOD ITEMS NOT REMOVED OR PROTECTED MAY BE SEALED BY THE FUMIGATOR AT AN ADDITIONAL CHARGE OR MAY BE DESTROYED.**
8. The day before the fumigation, the soil around the foundation should be soaked with water to a depth of several inches for at least one foot out from the foundation. This is done as an aid in sealing and may help protect plants close to the building. Plants should be cut back to allow 12 to 18 inches clearance around the building.
9. Automatic heating, cooling or ventilating systems must be turned off. If burglar alarms are present, leave operating instructions for the fumigator. Motion detectors must be disabled.
10. The fumigator must have access to all areas of the building, including areas normally locked such as private rooms and garages. All drawers, cabinets, and closets must be opened. The crew will leave these areas open for complete aeration. If you have secured storage such as locked closets, or wall, floor, or walk-in safes, you must be present to open them before the fumigation and during aeration; or remove valuables and leave these areas open. **ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE CREW TO RECEIVE AND RETURN KEYS MUST BE MADE PRIOR TO THE FUMIGATION.**
11. We request that the owner or occupant remove any antennas and/or satellite dishes from the roof (or other areas). We are not responsible for damage, alignment, or poor reception after the fumigation.
12. Electrical service must be available during the entire fumigation. Gas service will be shut off at the meter and at the appliances. If gas refrigerator or freezer is present, it will not be operable and it will defrost. Where local regulations permit, the fumigator will re-light pilots. In areas serviced by Pacific Gas & Electric, and any other areas where required, the utility company must come out to check the service and reconnect.
13. Owner, owner's agent and/or occupants who do not comply with the requirements of fumigation as stated herein will not hold the termite operator and the fumigation licensee responsible for any liabilities connected with the fumigation procedure. If the building(s) have tenant occupants, it is the responsibility of the owner or an authorized agent or manager to distribute copies of this notice to all such occupants by the use of U.S. mail, posting on the front door, or hand direct delivery.

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- A. Our crews must fumigate several structures in various locations each day. Therefore, any time of day given for the fumigation to begin will be an approximate time only.
- B. We do not wish to inconvenience you by having you wait for our arrival on the day of the fumigation. When you decide on a date, talk it over with your termite inspector, make arrangements with regard to keys, and leave with the assurance that your building will be properly fumigated and will be safe for your return. **HOWEVER, IN CASE OF RAIN OR STRONG WINDS, THE JOB MAY HAVE TO BE POSTPONED. BE SURE AND LEAVE AN EMERGENCY PHONE NUMBER WHERE YOU CAN BE REACHED.**
- C. Climbing plants, fences, trellises and vines not detached from the building may be subject to damage. The fumigator will not be held responsible or liable.
- D. Fumigation sometimes requires the use of masking tape. Where the painted surface is old, oxidized, or improperly applied, peeling or chipping will occur. Even though these surfaces appear to be in good condition, we assume no responsibility for any damage.
- E. The roof surface and perimeter areas of the building must be walked upon and damage may occur. Neither the fumigation company nor its licensed fumigator will assume any liability for such damage or consequential damage that may occur to roofs or roof coverings and eaves below roofs. Also included are gutter, electrical wiring, patio and awning covers, solar heating panels or related plumbing, and living plants or landscaping at or near the subject property.
- F. We do not provide on-site security during the fumigation procedure or after the tarps are removed. Our insurance does not cover vandalism, break-in or theft.
- G. We assume no responsibility for damage resulting to or from the structures not built to construction codes.
- H. Old gas and water pipes may be damaged during the fumigation. The fumigator is not responsible for such damage. Gas and water pipes in good condition will not be damaged. The fumigator assumes no liability for damage resulting from faulty gas meters. We are not responsible for damage to old or faulty furnaces or water heaters resulting from re-lighting procedures; or for incidental or consequential costs from failure to re-light these appliances.
- I. All exterior doors (including water heater cabinet) for the building being fumigated must be lockable. If no hasp or other locking devices exist, state law requires nailing these doors shut. If the owner or agent has not provided adequate locks and nailing is performed by the fumigator, we will assume no responsibility or liability for damage to the door or door jamb. Nailing or locking is required to keep out any person, such as a small child, and to keep them from being trapped inside.
- J. If tarping of the building will require entrance into your neighbor's yard by the fumigator, his pets must be removed or tied up. It is your responsibility to inform your neighbor and secure permission to enter their property. Your neighbor's plants may be affected if growing on/or directly adjacent to your building.
